Between 1996 and 2002 she studied at the "Konrad Wolf" Academy for Film and Television (Hochschule für Film und Fernsehen, HFF) in Potsdam - Babelsberg, Germany.

Roberta Ricucci is Associate Professor at the University of Turin, dept. of Culture, Politics and Society, where she teaches Sociology of Inter-ethnic Relations and Sociology of Islam and is an affiliate at the Center for the Study of Religion and Society at the University of Notre Dame. She focuses her research on youth, education and religious pluralism in the framework of migratory processes in the Mediterranean area, she coordinates and works in international projects such as KIDS4ALLL (Key Inclusive Development Strategies for Lifelong Learning).

She is the author of numerous publications on the religious integration of diasporas, second generations and identity dynamics and the management of religious pluralism, including The New Southern European Diaspora (Lexington Books, 2017) and Protagonists of a plural country (SEB27, 2021).
